



### Internal assessment deadlines

Your internal work for NCEA assessment should be uploaded to My Te Kura as soon as possible before the **12 November 2023**. This will ensure your NCEA results are available when NZQA officially updates your Record of Achievement in mid-January 2024.

- If you are continuing with Te Kura next year You can continue to upload work to My Te Kura up until the end of January 2024 to count towards your 2023 school year. Results will be available on your Record of Achievement by the end of February 2024.
- If you are not continuing with Te Kura next year

  The last day to upload work in My Te Kura for marking and feedback is 1 December 2023. Results will be available on your Record of Achievement by the end of February 2024.

From April, your internal results will be reported each week to NZQA. Please regularly check your NZQA Student & Learners login during the year to ensure all your internal results have been correctly reported. How to login is detailed on the next page.

### 2023 external entries

Instructions on how to register for externally assessed standards will be emailed to you when our NCEA Registration facility opens in June.

If you register for externally assessed standards this year, these entries will show on your NZQA Student & Learners login page **after** your NCEA registration has been finalised and confirmed by email.

## **NZQA** student login

Go to <a href="www.nzqa.govt.nz/login">www.nzqa.govt.nz/login</a> to check your NCEA internal results, external entries, and personal information on the NZQA website.

- If you have never logged in before, click 'Create an Account'.
- If you have logged in before, click 'Students & Learners Login'.

You'll need your National Student Number (NSN) but if you don't know it, please contact your kaimanaaki (learning advisor). If you don't have a kaimanaaki, contact your subject teacher.

# **Appeals**

If you don't agree with the grade for an internal assessment, you should, in the first instance, request your subject teacher review the marking of the assessment.

If you are still not satisfied with the explanation given by your teacher, you have one month (from the time you received the marked work back from your teacher) to make a formal appeal. A Student Assessment Appeal form must be completed and emailed to the Assessment & Qualifications Lead, Principal's Nominee at Te Kura.

An appeal form is available in your 'My Te Kura'.
