Painting and Drawing Taster

Wintec

This is a one-day workshop with an emphasis on understanding the relationship between drawing and painting. It is very much a hands-on approach where students work through a series of smaller studies and finish on a very large-scaled workpiece.

The session begins with a slide presentation on learning to read pictorial space visually and to contextualise this learning to the student's own work. From the examples shown, the students apply this thinking through a set of exercises using imagery they have brought to the workshop from school.

The students are encouraged to experiment and explore with the media supplied and thus work outside their comfort zone in order to expand their visual arts knowledge. Along the way, they will have a lot of fun with new discoveries made.

Store Detective

ITS by Distance (Ako Pai)

This is a great package that will provide you with the means to explain practices used to detect and reduce staff and customer theft or fraud in a retail or distribution environment. You will learn the legal definitions, terminology used and the consequences that can occur.

Delivery: This course is offered as distance work either digitally, or paper-based.

Credits: 7 credits at NCEA level three.

Retail Ready (Gateway Programs)

Service IQ

This is a new programme that has been developed for students who wish to complete a Gateway placement at either a Warehouse, Warehouse Stationery, Countdown, or other store. (Formally the program was known as “Red Shirts”, “Blue Shirts”, “SEEDS”).

Students first complete an online programme offering 15 credits at Level 2 and then they will be able to go on to complete a five day work placement in stores.

The online component enables students to complete theory learning over five online workshops with support from a ServiceIQ tutor. There will also be an option for students who have connectivity issues.

Students will be able to complete their programme with a five day work placement in one of the retail workplaces above.

Credits: 15 credits at NCEA level two, plus additional based on placement.

International College Tourism by distance

If you have ever wondered what it would be like to help people plan their holidays or work for a travel agency, then you may enjoy studying [Tourism](#). Te Kura has partnered with International College of Tourism to provide distance learning in Tourism for students.

Social and Community Services Sector Vocational pathway

This sector is all about enabling and support. It can be exciting, personally very rewarding, and physically and emotionally demanding. The range of jobs is huge: from monitoring and protecting people and property (as in corrections, defence, or firefighting) to caring for people in need (as in health care, community and social work, medicine, or therapy). This is a sector that's essential for community well-being and safety.

Communication Skills – Gisborne

The Learning Place

This course develops learners' speaking, presenting and listening skills and is an exciting opportunity for students to learn about and present a range of communication skills in different contexts. Learners will present a social speech, deliver a presentation, and interact and respond with others. Perfect for all students needing to come out of their shell or develop their communication skills.

Course Requirements: Learners must present a five-minute-long presentation and a three-minute-long social speech in front of an audience.

Credits: Ten credits at NCEA level 3.
