<b>Years 1–8</b> Curriculum adaptation	<b>Learning Support needs</b> Individual Education Plan needed. Programme to be developed with Te Kura to overcome barriers and plan for inclusion of the student in the school.	Up to 75% of the learning programme	Special Education needs
	<b>Gifted &amp; talented</b> Current Individual Education Plan, which is less than six months old. Student must be working in the top 5% for their age range in the subject requested and testing results must be provided.	2	Gifted
<b>Years 7–8</b> Curriculum capability	<b>Technology</b> Geographically isolated schools with no Year 7–8 technology tuition. Requires Ministry of Education approval.	1	Technology
	<b>Te Reo</b> Requires Ministry of Education Manager approval for all levels of te reo Māori.	1	Te reo Māori – access
<b>Years 9–15</b> Curriculum adaptation	<b>Learning Support needs</b> Students who have identified learning support needs and are two or more years below their chronological age in the curriculum area being applied for. Evidence is required to show that Te Kura tuition is essential. Applications are considered on an individual basis.	2	Remedial
	<b>Reintegration</b> Assistance for students to stay or reintegrate into school.	2	Risk of exclusion/ expulsion <b>or</b> psychological/ psycho-social
	<b>Gifted &amp; talented</b> Requires results to show student in top 5% of their age group for that subject and an Individual Education Plan.	2	Gifted
	<b>Subject not available</b> Secondary schools with fewer than 600 students. Subjects not offered or that are not available in that school's language of tuition (e.g. English or te reo Māori).	4	Subject not available
	<b>Approved cultural exchange</b> Student requires subjects on return to their country.	2	Exchange student
	<b>Transferring student</b> Year 9–13 student has transferred from another school. The dual enrolment provides subjects started during the same year at their previous face-to-face school until the end of school year.	2	Transferring student
	<b>Cultural affinity</b> Student has demonstrated a family or cultural affinity with a particular ethnic group requiring tuition in that language.	1	Language for ethnic

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<b>Years 9–15</b> Curriculum capability	<b>Summer School</b> Short-term enrolments (over summer break between terms 4 and 1) for students to earn additional credits or specific internal standards in NCEA (limited to 1000 students per year).	4	(This TES gateway will be established for Summer School 2019–20)
<b>Years 11–15</b> Curriculum capability	<b>Small senior classes – NCEA Level 1–3 courses only</b> A school has only a small number of students studying a subject at Year 11, 12 or 13 levels. Maximum total of six students for this category per level per subject for each school.	2	Small senior classes
<b>All Years</b> Curriculum capability	<b>Emergency staff vacancy</b> No suitable applicants are available. Minimum of four weeks and a maximum of one term. Approvals can be reviewed each term.	Subject related	Emergency staff vacancy
	<b>School emergency</b> Where a community has suffered a natural disaster, which has impacted on the school's ability to provide education for a significant period of time. Approved by the Secretary of Education.	Approved at time of emergency response	School emergency (Only available in TES at time of emergency)
<b>Regional Health School</b>	<b>Curriculum capability</b> Health School students may enrol for all or part of their learning. Individual Education Plan required.	No limit	Regional Health School
<b>Special Schools and Govt Institutions</b>	<b>Curriculum capability</b> Student's learning needs are beyond what could reasonably be expected of the school or institution. Individual Education Plan required.	2	Special Schools and Govt Inst
<b>Realm Country Schools</b>	<b>Curriculum capability</b> For realm country (Cook Islands, Niue and Tokelau) students whose school, due to its location, is unable to provide access to subjects	As approved on application	Subject not available
<b>Activity Centre</b>	<b>Subject not available</b> Students are attending an Activity Centre.	4	Activity Centre
<b>Alternative Education</b>	<b>Subject not available</b> Students are attending an Alternative Education Centre	4	Alternative Education
<b>Young Parent</b>	<b>Subject not available</b> Students are attending a Teen Parent Unit.	4	Young Parent
