Writing a recount

The purpose of a recount is to list and describe past experiences by retelling events in the order in which they happened. Recounts can either inform or entertain their audience (or both). Recounts can be real or imaginary.

How to write a recount:

First paragraph – Introduction: Tell who is in the story, when it happened, where and why.

Second paragraph – First main event: Tell what happened first in your story.

Third Paragraph – Second main event: Tell what happened next in the story.

You may need **more paragraphs** to tell what happened after that.

Final paragraph – Conclusion: Tell how you felt about the events.

Tips:

- Write in the past tense (e.g. she climbed, it fell, he laughed).
- Use lots of verbs (doing words) and adverbs (words that describe or add more detail to verbs).
- Use words such as next, later, then, after, first.
- Use lots of detail to add interest or humour.
